Developing on-line search skills

While the agrowing sense of unease that my librarianship skills were rapidly becoming outdated, but also with a definite aversion to the rigours of after-work parttime study, 1 was pleased to find that ALIA, in conjunction with Edith Cowan University, were offering professional development courses.


My first choice for study was 'Developing search strategy skills for online searching', the first unit of the three unit course *Upgrading search strategy skills*. This unit was an easy-tofollow work module, practically orientated and included a five-hundred word un-graded assignment over ten weeks.

Instead of accessing the Telnet version of the CARL UnCover database used for the hands-on tutorials I was able to access the course through the Internet. This posed no real problems although the search commands differed from those in the workbook. The course will be even more valuable to me when I follow up with practice on other online databases, possibly through the Open Learning Centre.

Because I had some queries about the Internet version of the course and the assignment requirements, I contacted the lecturer in Western Australia by phone and found her very helpful; email offers an alternative means of communication. My assignment was carefully marked with helpful and constructive comments.

Attempting this course has enabled me to define and structure my online searching skills and knowledge, and has encouraged me that further study may not be too bad after all. I will certainly be undertaking other units and can recommend this course as an introduction to online searching. Thank you ALIA and Edith Cowan University.
