ALIA members of the Far North Coast Regional Group and their guests enjoyed a night out with Margaret Haines, principal advisor to the United Kingdom Library and Information Commission at the Classic Thai Restaurant in Lismore on 30 June. Together with distinguished guests Margaret Butterworth and Kay Poustie, Ms Haines presented the dinner party with an overview of her role in providing the United Kingdom government with a national focus of expertise in the library and information sector. The dinner was held on the eve of the 10th Annual Country Public Libraries conference.

Richmond-Tweed Regional Library hosted this year's conference under the theme *Public libraries: excellent value in anyone's books*. Outspoken advocate for public libraries, and former ALIA president, Jenny Cram addressed delegates with her views of municipal libraries in the new millennium. Reverend Tim Costello presented a paper concerning the future role of the public library, as well as presenting a paper on behalf of Emeritus Professor Eileen Byrne detailing proposed models of regional local government to better disperse vital funding to all regions of Australia. Reverend Costello detailed his own experience as former mayor of St Kilda and the funding discrepancies he noted during his time as mayor.

Other conference highlights were the conferring of a number of awards including the Inaugural CPLA Colin Mills Scholarship to John Young for his outstanding contribution to the library and information sector. The 1998 Bookmobile Operator of the Year

David Quinlivan Award was given to Robert Nelson, and two drivers received highly commended awards: Jeremy Brown and Toni Daymond. Rookie of the Year 1998 was Annette Ralston, with Peter Keogh being highly commended.

Local author Di Morrissey addressed delegates at one of the wonderful social functions and inspired many. The conference was a success with 302 delegates, and helped to heighten the great importance of public libraries to the people of Australia. ■
