Northern Territory Library leads with new platform

The Northern Territory Library Network has signed a contract with Altarama Systems for the most innovative library software suite available.

The contract covers the Virtua library automation package from the United States, the Fulcrum search engine from Canada, and an Australian-developed Z39.50 Aurora Web Gateway. Server hardware, installation, training and support services are also included.

Announcing the result of an exhaustive selection process Lea Giles-Peters, the assistant secretary Northern Territory Library, commented: 'We serve Australia's most diverse collection of libraries across a huge region. We needed a library service delivery platform - not just a replacement library management system.

'With the new system, to go live early in 1999, we can integrate technical processing with comprehensive multi-database, multi-media access, delivered through the Northern Territory Government network and through the Web.

'Our substantial traditional and digital collections will be available globally locally and through a contemporary interface designed to encourage use.'
