
## Extend your stay and see more of Tasmania



Several before and after conference tours have been arranged for conference participants to see a little of the wonders that Tasmania has to offer.

On either the Saturday before or after the conference treat yourself to a Secret Gardens Tour. This is a personally guided private tour that starts at approximately 9:30am to visit some of Hobart's most beautiful gardens including the House of Herbs, the famous Island Fudge Factory on the site of the women's prison and Ashfield in Sandy Bay, a participant in the Open Gardens Scheme. Lunch will be in Richmond, one of Australia's oldest towns. There is a minimum of five persons and the cost is \$65.00.

On the Sunday before or after the conference enjoy a Battery Point Ramble. This is a personally-guided private tour that includes a visit to Narryna, a historical museum, Arthur Circus, Kelly's Steps, Salamanca, and Knopwoods pub for a pre-lunch drink and poetry reading. Lunch will be at the historical Royal Tennis Courts following a demonstration of this ancient game. The numbers for this tour are limited to fifty, with a minimum of ten required to run it. The cost is \$65.00.

What better way to recover from the activity and excitement of the conference than a relaxing Huon Valley Waterways and Wilderness tour on Friday 27 August. This tour will take you to the Huon Valley where you will visit a jam factory, enjoy morning tea Narryna, Battery Point: you can visit this historical museum on the Battery Point Ramble on the Sunday before or after the conference

and watch the process of producing quality jams. Enjoy a cruise on the Huon River to the Atlantic Salmon Farms, learn about aquaculture and the growing of salmon. After a home cooked lunch you will continue to the Great Southern Forests where you will experience rainforest and wilderness before returning to Hobart by 5:30pm.
