he Queensland Library Promotion Council (QLPC) is a volunteer organisation dedicated to promoting libraries in Queensland. Each year they offer awards and grants to the Queensland library industry. The winners were announced at the State Library of Queensland on 19 May.

### Queensland Library Achiever of the Year Award, sponsored by Queensland Library Supplies

This award recognises individuals working in any sector of the library industry in Queensland, and provides a mechanism to promote excellence and to increase the profile of the profession. Diane Vance, director of Community and Cultural Services at Thuringowa won the award for her long-standing commitment to libraries and her profession. Anne Robbie, librarian at Moranbah Public Library, received a highly-commended award for her energy, enthusiasm and leadership in her local community. Lynette Kellow, volunteer librarian at the Queensland Writers Centre, received an honourable mention

### The Joan Gamble — Peter Pal Library Supplier Grant, sponsored by Peter Pal Library Supplier

This grant provides libraries with funding for special services or activities for people with disabilities, the elderly, people from a non-Eng-

lish-speaking background, or adult literacy programs. Gold Coast City Council Library Service received a \$700 grant to purchase equipment to extend their existing resource library for children with special needs to include material for older persons with special needs. Highfields Library received \$300 for their Year 2000 party for elderly citizens.

#### The QLPC James Bennett Library Promotion Grant, sponsored by James Bennett Ptv Ltd

This grant encourages library staff to promote and publicise the library to their clients, to offer the library a cash grant as an incentive to experiment with a new or different promotional idea; and to give library staff an opportunity to prove to their organisation the value and importance of promotional activities, and the use that can be made of funds in this area.

Banana Shire Library Service won \$1500 to stage their historic photographic exhibition and photograph competition to celebrate Biloela's 75th anniversary. Highfields Library and Mount Isa City Library received encouragement awards.
