In the article, Ivan mentioned under the heading 'Usability and accessibility':

'A recent survey of the home pages of nearly 700 federal government websites has shown that none had valid HTML, and only thirty-six were able to pass any form of accessibility test...'

Would you be able to point me to where I might get a copy of this survey, and its details?

Ed: The 'survey' was a verb, not noun: but you can do the same

thing right now, and validate the results in real time, and be more up-to-date.

Members of the Link Institute (an Australian e-list discussing internet-related issues) were discussing website accessibility and went on to view the 'portal' at http://www.fed.gov.au which lists 699 federal agencies.

Of the 699 listed, they ran the validity checker from W3C (http://validator.w3.org/) and then Bobby (http://bobby.watchfire.com/) over these home pages (only the home pages: it would have been worse to do entire sites) and came up with the results mentioned.
