## LinkBuilder from Fretwell-Downing Informatics

ZPORTAL users enter the citation details in LinkBuilder and OpenLinking resolves the metadata and provides appropriate links to the full-text.

LinkBuilder also enables users to browse the journal titles that are OpenURL enabled. The current release of OpenLinking includes configuration for 25 750 journal titles and 354 publisher templates.

More than ninety per cent of the top STM publishers have signed on, creating a total of 7487 full-text e-journals now available via SwetsWise.

### WA TAFE libraries select Voyager, Encompass

Nature Publishing Group has launched the Nature Archive: January 1987 – December 1996, providing online access to every article published in *Nature* from a decade of science. Users can now access an additional 65 000 articles: 512 issues from 60 volumes.

Users can freely search the complete archives of *Nature* from a single interface at <http://www.nature.com> or browse by issue at <http://www.nature.com/nature/archive>. Access to full-text articles from the Nature Archive 1987–1996 is available to users via a Nature Archive site licence, which can be added to an existing *Nature* site licence. Non-site licence customers can purchase individual articles.

### CAUL representation on Blackwell's Library Advisory Board

Blackwell Publishing is pleased to announce the addition of Diane Costello, executive officer of the Council of Australian University Librarians, to its Library Advisory Board.

The first meeting of the Library Advisory Board took place in Berlin, Germany, on 4 August whilst Blackwell waited for confirmation of an Australian representative.
