Are you eligible to use the CP post-nominal and apply for a Certified Practitioner certificate?

When you accumulate the minimum thirty points in the first year that you participate in the ALIA CPD scheme, you will be eligible to use the CP post-nominal and may

continue to do so as long as you continue to meet the CPD compliance requirements. To ensure your ongoing compliance, you have to accumulate 120 points over a triennium and maintain a personal record of the time spent on CPD activities to satisfy audit enquiries.

The Summary of Activities table (available at http://alia.org.au/members-only/education/cpd/userguide/activities.html) can assist you in selecting your CPD activities, and provides details about the documentary evidence required to comply with audit requirements.

If you have been an associate or technician member of the ALIA CPD scheme since July 2000 (or earlier) and have maintained compliance during that time, you may also be eligible to become an Associate Fellow of ALIA. 
