## A first for Alzheimer's Australia

Willoughby City Library has become the first public library to benefit from Alzheimer's Australia's new program to provide information to the community through public libraries. In April, the library received a collection of books and videos on dementia supplied by Alzheimer's Australia NSW. The Gordon Social and Recreational Club donated the collection through the Community Development Support Expenditure Grant Scheme, 2003.

During Australian Library and Information Week on 27 May, a celebration was held in the library to thank the Gordon Club for its generosity.

Approximately thirty invited guests and library visitors attended the function.

The mayoress, Mrs Beth Reilly, representing the mayor, councillor Pat Reilly, presented a certificate of appreciation to the Gordon Club and launched the dementia collection.

Willoughby Council's general manager John Owen also spoke, commending the Gordon Club and Alzheimer's Australia NSW for the work that they do in the community. He highlighted the importance of the library as a community resource, mentioning that more than two thousand people use the library every day.

Representatives from Alzheimer's Australia briefed

the invited guests and library visitors about dementia and Alzheimer's Australia's role in informing, assisting and supporting those with Alzheimer's and their carers. Alzheimer's Australia also spoke about their plans to provide further information through public libraries after this initial phase.

'Willoughby City Library is delighted to have received the library resources,' said library service manager, Frances Sims. 'The collection will help fill a real community information need. We hope that Willoughby Library can in future work with Alzheimer's Australia to provide quality information to the community about dementia, and expand the collection.'
