

# Questions on notice

In 2003 the format of the National Policy Congress encouraged groups to forward questions on notice for the national meeting in Canberra. The questions asked ranged from queries relating to professional qualifications through to how the Association is handling international issues. Q: What arrangements can be made to provide funds for Groups so that they can pay for dinner (or similar function) for guests who are being honoured, or who are invited speakers at that dinner/function?

A: Groups are asked to work on a break-even budget over the year. Groups have the option of covering the costs of the situation listed above in the following ways:

- ensure that the fee charged for the event is sufficient to cover these costs
- ensure that other events run through that year cover the cost so that the group achieves break even by the end of the year, or
- seek sponsorship for the event

Q: How are international issues being handled? (Note: APSIG is doing a good job, but it covers only a particular geographic area)

A: The executive director has been consulting with the convenor of the International Relations Policy Advisory Group. There has

been some issues significance happening and both the ED and convenor are keeping a watching brief as many of these are being picked up through IFLA especially now that Alex Byrne is president-elect of IFLA. The Association has also been involved in the cultural alliance established by the Federal Government to determine how best Australia can contribute to reconstruction in Iraq.

Q: What has happened to the money handed over by groups? Where is the transparency in this process?

Details of the groups (divisions) funds is included in the annual financial statement under Cash Assets — Divisions/groups and under Other Assets — Group conference funds. This financial statement is included in the annual report; the most recent report was published in the April 2003 issue of *inCite*. An audit is conducted annually prior to the release of the annual financial statement by an external organisation. ■
