The ALIA Health Libraries Australia — Swets Professional Envoy Award recognises a health library and information professional who demonstrates significant achievement, a commitment to continuing excellence and/or leadership in the provision of health information in Australia.

The ALIA Health Libraries Australia — Swets Professional Envoy Award is a biennial award that aims to enable the recipient to travel outside Australia to investigate significant developments and/or recent innovations in health and biomedical libraries and information services. Candidates examining new developments, technologies or services not yet seen in Australia that would be of interest or relevance to Australian health libraries are more likely to be successful in being granted an award.

Candidates must be currently employed as a librarian or information professional in the health or biomedical sector and must be members of ALIA Health Libraries Australia (HLA). Current members of the HLA executive are excluded from applying for the award. No formal academic qualifications are required.
