## Churchill Fellowship winner

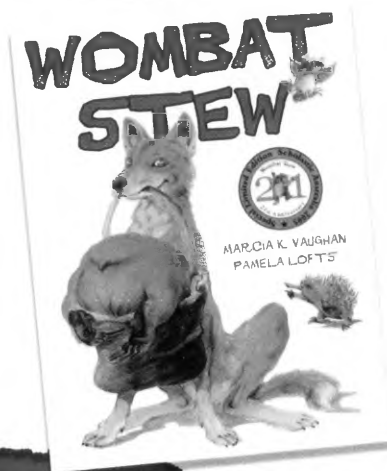
