Project Transfer Compliance aims to improve procedures for journals transferring between publishers by providing a set of guidelines covering issues such as ongoing access provision to online content. exchange of subscriber lists, DOI and URL transfer as well as clarifying issues relating to born-digital versus newly digitised backfile content. As first to sign up to the Project Transfer code of practice, Taylor & Francis recognise this as an important step in helping publishers, libraries and subscription agents to provide an improved service to the academic community, ensuring that the transfer of a journal does not interfere with academic research.
