Her suggestion of donating to the donkey library, part of the Oxfam Unwrapped program, instead of buying a Christmas present for one's nearest and dearest, soon became a popular alternative to negotiating the Christmas crowds while also helping people in developing nations.

A donkey library distributes HIV and AIDS literature to approximately 2,000 youths and adults every month, reaching those in rural communities who have limited access to school and community.



But instead of keeping the idea to the individual, the suggestion was taken up by the list as a whole, who agreed to donate as little as \$2.00 each in an effort to raise enough money for a donkey library.

Suddenly news of the effort spread via friends, family, the ALIA Board Blog, co-workers and donations came from many sources.

Thanks to a tech doing a little 'day dreaming' on the elist, ALIA techs from around Australia and New Zealand raised \$4388.10 for Oxfam Unwrapped in just over a month and were able to purchase:

1 mobile donkey library, 2 vet training courses, 2 gardener's packs, 9 stay in school, 8 literacy classes for adults, 30 eye health checks, 18 clean water kits, 2 shoes for a carer, 1 sewing training and 2 soccer balls.
