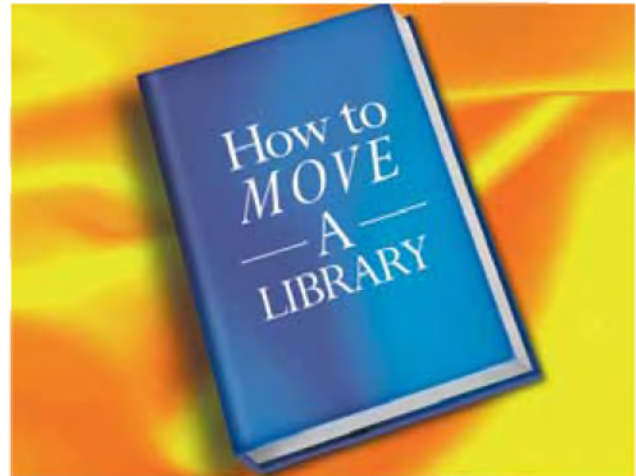


National Year of Reading 2012
