Children from Pularumpi School celebrated National Simultaneous Storytime a bit earlier this year. The school is located at Pirlangimpi, Melville Island, 70 kms north of Darwin.

The school provided an excellent room, which was set up with banners, National Year of Reading and National Simultaneous Story merchandise, and a rolling camera.

Sixty enthusiastic children and teachers gave a big welcome to the visitors and then got involved with Nick's story with great sound effects.

After the story, Nick asked the children to suggest some local animals, which he drew on the white board around his drawing of the bear.

Nick then added the characteristics of each animal onto the bear with help from everyone: A turtle shell for Bear's back, a kangaroo tail for Bear, etc. This was great fun. Nick spoke about being a writer and illustrator and encouraged the children to write and illustrate their own stories.

Nick concluded the session by reading his new book the *The Very Hungry Bear* which was released on 1 June.
