

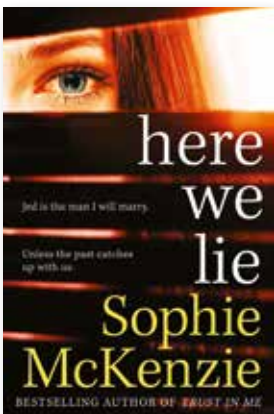
BOOK BITES

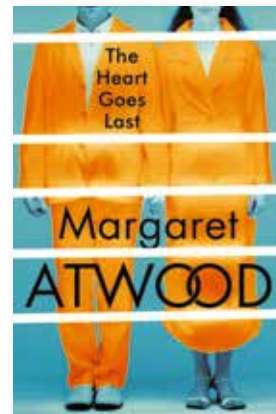

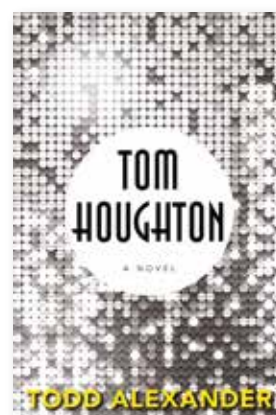
them: in each girl's past is a sexual scandal with a powerful man.
