(b) special certificate (not to be issued or remain in force after the thirtieth day of June, One thousand nine hundred and seven), to be issued to a Pacific Island labourer whom in the opinion of the Minister it will not be convenient to return to his island immediately after the thirty-first day of December, One thousand nine hundred and six.

(3.) A special certificate under this section shall, subject to the terms and conditions expressed in the certificate, have the effect of excepting the Pacific Island labourer mentioned therein from any specified provisions of this Act, but may be cancelled by the

Minister at any time.

(4.) A general certificate under this section shall, subject to the terms and conditions expressed in the certificate, have the effect of excepting the Pacific Island labourer mentioned therein from any specified provisions of this Act, but may be cancelled by the Minister if at any time he has reason to think such certificate has been obtained by false and fraudulent representation.

3. Any person aiding or abetting any Pacific Island labourer in Aiding and the obtaining a certificate of exemption by means of false and abetting the obtaining a fraudulent representation to the Minister shall be deemed guilty of certificate. an offence against this Act.

Penalty: Fifty pounds, or three months' imprisonment, or both. Penalty.

BE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, the Preamble. Senate, and the House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Australia, for the purpose of appropriating the grant originated in the House of Representatives as follows:-

1. This Act may be cited as the Appropriation Act 1906-7.

Short title.

2. The Treasurer may issue out of the Consolidated Revenue Issue and Fund, and apply towards making good the supply hereby granted \$\frac{application}{\pmu3,054,730}\$.

to His Majesty for the service of the year ending the thirtieth day of June One thousand nine hundred and seven, the sum of Three million fifty-four thousand seven hundred and eighty pounds.

Appropriation of supplies, £4,262,207.

3. All sums granted by this Act and the other Acts mentioned in the First Schedule to this Act out of the Consolidated Revenue. Fund towards making good the supply granted to His Majesty, amounting as appears by the said Schedule in the aggregate to the sum of Four million two hundred and sixty-two thousand two hundred and seven pounds, are appropriated and shall be deemed to have been appropriated as from the date of the passing of the Act No. 1 of 1906 for the purposes and services expressed in the Second Schedule.
