An Act to grant and apply out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund a sum for War Pensions.

[Assented to 24th June, 1948.]

BE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, the Senate, and the House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Australia, for the purpose of appropriating the grant originated in the House of Representatives, as follows:—

- 1. This Act may be cited as the War Pensions Appropriation Act Short title. 1948.
- 2. This Act shall come into operation on the day on which it commencement receives the Royal Assent.

BE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, the Senate, and the House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Australia, for the purpose of appropriating the grant originated in the House of Representatives, as follows:—

1. This Act may be cited as the Appropriation Act (No 2) 1947-48. Short title.

Commencement.

2. This Act shall come into operation on the day on which it receives the Royal Assent.

Issue and application of £40,000,000.

3. The Treasurer may issue out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund and apply towards making good the supply hereby granted to His Majesty for the service of the year ending the thirtieth day of June, One thousand nine hundred and forty-eight, the sum of Forty million pounds.

Appropriation.

4. The sum granted by this Act is appropriated, and shall be deemed to have been appropriated as from the first day of July, One thousand nine hundred and forty-seven, for the purposes and services specified in the Schedule to this Act in relation to the financial year ending the thirtieth day of June, One thousand nine hundred and forty-eight.
