

CONSOLIDATED REVENUE.

No. 1 of 1901.

An Act to grant and apply out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund the sum of Four hundred and ninety-one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two pounds to the service of the period ending the thirtieth day of June One thousand nine hundred and one.

[Assented to 25th June, 1901.]

BE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty and the Senate and the House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Australia for the purpose of appropriating the grant originated in the House of Representatives as follows :—

Preamble.

1. There shall and may be issued and applied for or towards making good the supply hereby granted to His Majesty for the service of the period ending the thirtieth day of June One thousand nine hundred and one the sum of Four hundred and ninety-one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two pounds out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund, for the purposes and services expressed in the Schedule to this Act, and the Treasurer is hereby authorized and empowered to issue and apply the moneys authorized to be issued and applied.

Issue and application of £491,882.

2. The said sum shall be available to satisfy the warrants under the hand of the Governor-General in respect of any purposes and services set forth in the said Schedule.

Sum available for the purposes set forth in Schedule.

3. No moneys shall be expended under the authority of this Act after the thirtieth day of June One thousand nine hundred and one.

ACTS INTERPRETATION.

No. 2 of 1901.

An Act for the Interpretation of Acts of Parliament
and for Shortening their Language.

[Assented to 12th July, 1901.]

BE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty the Senate
and the House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of
Australia as follows :—

SHORT TITLE AND APPLICATION.

Short title.

1. This Act may be cited as the *Acts Interpretation Act* 1901.

Application of
Act.

2. This Act shall apply to all Acts of the Parliament, including
this Act, and shall be binding on the Crown.
