CUSTOMS TARIFF (PAPUA AND NEW GUINEA PREFERENCE).

No. 4 of 1934.

An Act relating to Customs Tariff preference on goods the produce of the Territory of Papua and on goods the produce of the Territory of New Guinea.

[Assented to 12th July, 1934.]

BE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, the Senate, and the House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Australia, as follows:-

- 1. This Act may be cited as the Customs Tariff (Papua and New Short title. Guinea Preference) 1934.
- 2. This Act shall be deemed to have commenced on the tenth commencement. day of March One thousand nine hundred and thirty-three.
- 3. The Customs Tariff (Papua and New Guinea Preference) 1926 Repeat is repealed.
- 4. The Customs Act 1901-1930 shall be incorporated and read Incorporation. as one with this Act.
- 5.—(1.) This section shall apply to the goods specified in the certain imports Schedule to this Act if produced or manufactured in the Territory New Guinea of Papua or the Territory of New Guinea and imported direct from to be free of duty. either of those Territories.

- (2.) Goods to which this section applies shall—
 - (a) if imported into Australia on or after the tenth day of March One thousand nine hundred and thirty-three; or
 - (b) if imported into Australia before that date and not entered for home consumption until after that date,

be free of all duties of customs imposed on such goods by the Customs Tariffs 1933.
