CUSTOMS TARIFF (CANADIAN PREFERENCE).

No. 33 of 1950.

An Act to amend the *Customs Tariff (Canadian Preference) 1934-1948.*

[Assented to 7th December, 1950.]

BE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, the Senate, and the House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Australia, as follows :—

Short title
and citation.

1.—(1.) This Act may be cited as the *Customs Tariff (Canadian Preference) 1950.*

(2.) The *Customs Tariff (Canadian Preference) 1934-1948** is in this Act referred to as the Principal Act.

(3.) The Principal Act, as amended by this Act, may be cited as the *Customs Tariff (Canadian Preference) 1934-1950.*

Amendment of
Tariff.

2. The Schedule to the Principal Act is amended as set out in the Schedule to this Act and duties of Customs are hereby imposed in accordance with the first-mentioned Schedule as amended by the last-mentioned Schedule.

Time of
imposition of
duties.

3. The time of the imposition of the duties of Customs imposed by this Act is the ninth day of June, One thousand nine hundred and fifty, at nine o'clock in the forenoon, reckoned according to standard time in the Australian Capital Territory, and this Act shall be deemed to have come into operation at that time.

AUSTRALIAN SOLDIERS' REPATRIATION.

No. 34 of 1950.

An Act to amend the *Australian Soldiers' Repatriation Act 1920-1949*, and for other purposes.

[Assented to 12th December, 1950.]

BE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, the Senate, and the House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Australia, as follows:—

1.—(1.) This Act may be cited as the *Australian Soldiers' Repatriation Act 1950*.

Short title
and citation.

(2.) The *Australian Soldiers' Repatriation Act 1920-1949** is in this Act referred to as the Principal Act.

(3.) The Principal Act, as amended by this Act, may be cited as the *Australian Soldiers' Repatriation Act 1920-1950*.

2.—(1.) Sections six, eight, nine, ten and eleven of this Act shall come into operation on a date to be fixed by Proclamation.

Commencement.

(2.) The amendments of the Principal Act effected by paragraphs (a) and (f) of section twelve and by paragraphs (a) and (c) of section thirty-three, and sections twenty, twenty-one, twenty-two,
