## CUSTOMS TARIFF (NEW ZEALAND PREFERENCE) VALIDATION.

### No. 39 of 1942.

An Act to provide for the Validation of Collections of Duties of Customs under Customs Tariff (New Zealand Preference) Proposals.

[Assented to 4th September, 1942.]

**B**E it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, the Senate, and the House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Australia, as follows :—

1. This Act may be cited as the *Customs Tariff (New Zealand Preference) Validation Act 1942.* Short title.
