An Act relating to Duties of Excise.

[Assented to 3rd December, 1962.]

 B^{E} it enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, the Senate, and the House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Australia, as follows:-

1.-(1.) This Act may be cited as the Excise Tariff 1962. Short title (2.) The Excise Tariff 1921-1961* is in this Act referred to as the Principal Act.

(3.) The Principal Act, as amended by this Act, may be cited as the Excise Tariff 1921-1962.

2. This Act shall be deemed to have come into operation commenceon the eighth day of November, One thousand nine hundred and sixty-two.

3. The Schedule to the Principal Act is amended as set out Amendment of Tariff. in the Schedule to this Act and duties of Excise are imposed in accordance with the Schedule to the Principal Act as so amended.
