EXCISE TARIFF VALIDATION.

No. 7 of 1917.

An Act to provide for the Validation of Collections of Duties of Excise under Tariff proposals.

[Assented to 19th March, 1917.]

BE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, the Senate, and the House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Australia, as follows:—

1. This Act may be cited as the Excise Tariff Validation Act Short title and 1917.

2. In this Act "Tariff proposals" means the proposed Duties of Definition. Excise introduced into the House of Representatives on the third day of December, One thousand nine hundred and fourteen.

3. All Duties of Excise demanded or collected (whether before validation of or after the dissolution or expiry of the present House of under Tariff Representatives) pursuant to the Tariff proposals to which this Act proposals. applies shall be deemed to have been lawfully imposed and lawfully demanded or collected.

COMMONWEALTH ELECTORAL (WAR-TIME).

No. 8 of 1917.

An Act to make certain further provision, for the duration of the War and six months thereafter, in relation to Parliamentary Elections.

[Assented to 19th March, 1917.]

BE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, the Senate, and the House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Australia, as follows:-
