EXCISE TARIFF VALIDATION.

No. 22 of 1929.

An Act to provide for the Validation of Collections of Duties of Excise under Tariff Proposals.

[Assented to 13th September, 1929.]

BE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, the Senate, and the House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Australia, as follows:—

Short title and eltation.
Definition.

- 1. This Act may be cited as the Excise Tariff Validation Act 1929.
- 2. In this Act "Tariff proposals" means the proposed Duties of Excise introduced into the House of Representatives on the twenty-second day of August One thousand nine hundred and twenty-nine.

Validation of collections under Tarifi proposais. 3. All Duties of Excise demanded or collected (whether before the dissolution or expiry of the present House of Representatives or at or after such dissolution or expiry and on or before the twentieth day of December One thousand nine hundred and twenty-nine) pursuant to Tariff proposals shall be deemed to have been lawfully imposed and lawfully demanded or collected.

TASMANIA GRANT.

No. 23 of 1929.

An Act to grant and apply out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund a sum for the purposes of Financial Assistance to the State of Tasmania.

[Assented to 13th December, 1929.]

Presmble

BE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, the Senate, and the House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Australia, for the purpose of appropriating the grant originated in the House of Representatives, as follows:—

Short title.

- 1. This Act may be cited as the Tasmania Grant Act 1929.
- 2. Subject to this Act, there shall be payable, for the purposes of financial assistance to the State of Tasmania, in each financial year

Payment of £250,000 per annum for financial assistance to Tasmani.
