WAR PENSIONS APPROPRIATION.

No. 43 of 1926.

Au Act to grant and apply out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund a sum for War Pensions.

[Assented to 16th August, 1926.]

Preamble.

BE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, the Senate, and the House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Australia, for the purpose of appropriating the grant originated in the House of Representatives, as follows:—

Short Litle.

- 1. This Act may be cited as the War Pensions Appropriation Act 1926.
- Appropriation of £10,000,000 for war pensions.

2. There shall be payable out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund, which is hereby appropriated accordingly, for the purposes of the Trust Account established under the Audit Act 1901–1926, and known as the War Pensions Fund, the sum of Ten million pounds for war pensions.

INVALID AND OLD-AGE PENSIONS.

No. 44 of 1926.

An Act to amend sections sixteen and twenty-one of the *Invalid and Old-age Pensions Act* 1908-1925.

[Assented to 16th August, 1926.]

BE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, the Senate, and the House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Australia, as follows:—

Short title and citation.

- 1.—(1.) This Act may be cited as the *Invalid and Old-age Pensions Act* 1926.
- (2.) The Invalid and Old-age Pensions Act 1908-1925* is in this Act referred to as the Principal Act.

- (3.) The Principal Act, as amended by this Act, may be cited as the Invalid and Old-age Pensions Act 1908-1926.
- 2. This Act shall commence on a date to be fixed by commencement. Proclamation.
- 3. Section sixteen of the Principal Act is amended by inserting in paragraph (c) of sub-section (1.), after the word "Australia" (first Indians for occurring), the words "and Indians born in British India".

4. Section twenty-one of the Principal Act is amended by Qualification inserting in paragraph (b) of sub-section (1.), after the word indians for "Australia" (first occurring), the words "and Indians born in Particle Indians born in "Restrict Indians born in "and India British India''.

CUSTOMS TARIFF (No. 2).

No. 45 of 1926.

An Act relating to Duties of Customs.

[Assented to 16th August, 1926.]

BE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, the Senate, and the House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Australia, as follows:

1.—(1.) This Act may be cited as the Customs Tariff (No. 2) 1926.

Short title and citation.

- (2.) Section one of the Customs Tariff 1926 is amended by omitting sub-section (2.).
- (3.) The Customs Tariff 1921-1924,* as amended by the Customs Tariff 1926, is in this Act referred to as the Principal Act.
- (4.) The Principal Act, as amended by this Act, may be cited as the Customs Tariff 1921-1926.
- 2. The Schedule to the Principal Act is amended as set out in the Amendment Schedule to this Act, and duties of Customs are hereby imposed in accordance with the first-mentioned Schedule as amended by the lastmentioned Schedule.
