

## IRON AND STEEL PRODUCTS BOUNTY.

### No. 32 of 1929.

#### An Act to amend the *Iron and Steel Products Bounty Act 1922-1927*.

[Assented to 17th December, 1929.]

**B**E it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, the Senate, and the House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Australia, for the purpose of appropriating the grant originated in the House of Representatives, as follows:—

Preamble.

1.—(1.) This Act may be cited as the *Iron and Steel Products Bounty Act 1929*.

Short title and citation.

(2.) The *Iron and Steel Products Bounty Act 1922-1927\** is in this Act referred to as the Principal Act.

(3.) The Principal Act, as amended by this Act, may be cited as the *Iron and Steel Products Bounty Act 1922-1929*.

2.—(1.) The Schedule to the Principal Act is amended by omitting the item "Galvanised Sheets—£3 12s. per ton." and inserting in its stead the item "Galvanised Sheets—£4 10s. per ton."

Amendment of Schedule.

(2.) The amendment effected by this section shall commence on the first day of January One thousand nine hundred and thirty and shall thereupon apply to galvanised sheets manufactured in Australia and delivered from the factory on or after that date.

## LOAN.

### No. 33 of 1929.

#### An Act to authorize the Raising and Expending of certain Sums of Money.

[Assented to 17th December, 1929.]

**B**E it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, the Senate, and the House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Australia, as follows:—

1. This Act may be cited as the *Loan Act 1929*.

Short title.

2. The Treasurer may from time to time under the provisions of the *Commonwealth Inscribed Stock Act 1911-1927*, or under the

Authority to borrow £8,300,000.

provisions of any Act authorizing the issue of Treasury Bills, borrow moneys not exceeding in the whole the amount of Six million three hundred thousand pounds.

Purpose for which money may be borrowed.

3. The amount borrowed shall be issued and applied only for the expenses of borrowing and for the purposes of appropriations made or to be made by law.

Issue and application of £8,045,795.

4. There may be issued and applied out of the proceeds of any Loan raised under the authority of any Loan Act, including the present Act, the sum of Six million and forty-five thousand seven hundred and ninety-five pounds for the purposes set forth in the Schedule to this Act.

Unexpended appropriations lapse.

5. Where on the thirtieth day of June One thousand nine hundred and twenty-nine there remained unexpended any moneys appropriated by the *Loan Act (No. 1) 1928* and *Loan Act (No. 2) 1928*, the appropriation of the moneys so remaining unexpended shall be deemed to have lapsed on that date:

Provided that any moneys appropriated by the *Loan Act (No. 2) 1928* for the purposes of loan to the Federal Capital Commission and remaining unexpended on the thirtieth day of June One thousand nine hundred and twenty-nine shall not lapse on that date.
