No. 15 of 1925.

An Act to authorize the Raising and Expending of certain Sums of Money.

[Assented to 14th September, 1925.]

BE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, the Senate, and the House of Representatives of the and the House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Australia, as follows :---

Short title,

20

Authority to borrow £8,300,000.

Purpose for which money may be borrowed,

Issue and application of £8,031,482.

Unexpended appropriations lapse.

1. This Act may be cited as the Loan Act (No. 2) 1925.

2. The Treasurer may from time to time under the provisions of the Commonwealth Inscribed Stock Act 1911-1918, or under the provisions of any Act authorizing the issue of Treasury Bills, borrow moneys not exceeding in the whole the amount of Eight million three hundred thousand pounds.

3. The amount borrowed shall be issued and applied only for the expenses of borrowing and for the purposes of appropriations made or to be made by law.

4. There may be issued and applied out of the proceeds of any Loan raised under the authority of any Loan Act, including the present Act, the sum of Eight million and thirty-one thousand four hundred and eighty-two pounds for the purposes set forth in the First Schedule to this Act.

5. Where on the thirtieth day of June One thousand nine hundred and twenty-five there remain unexpended any moneys appropriated by any of the Acts specified in the Second Schedule to this Act, the appropriation of the moneys so remaining unexpended shall lapse on that date.


