

NATIONAL HEALTH AND PENSIONS INSURANCE
(EMPLOYEES' CONTRIBUTIONS).

No. 27 of 1938.

An Act to impose Liability upon Employees to make Contributions in respect of Insurance against certain Contingencies affecting Employees, and the Wives, Children, Widows, and Orphans of Employees.

[Assented to 5th July, 1938.]

BE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, the Senate, and the House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Australia, as follows :—

1. This Act may be cited as the *National Health and Pensions Insurance (Employees' Contributions) Act 1938*. Short title.
2. This Act shall commence on a date to be fixed by Proclamation. Commencement.
3. The *National Health and Pensions Insurance Act 1938* shall be incorporated and read as one with this Act. Incorporation.
4. In this Act, unless the contrary intention appears— Definitions.

“insurance” means insurance under the *National Health and Pensions Insurance Act 1938* ;

“National Health and Pensions Insurance” means insurance under the *National Health and Pensions Insurance Act 1938*

“the Schedule” means the Schedule to this Act.
5. Liability is imposed upon employees to make payments at the rates declared in this Act, being part of contributions payable in respect of National Health and Pensions Insurance. Imposition of liability to make payments.
- 6.—(1.) The payment imposed in respect of the insurance of an employed person shall be at such rate specified in paragraph (1) of the Schedule as is appropriate to the case. Rates of payments.

(2.) The payment imposed in respect of the insurance of a partially exempt employee shall be at such rate specified in paragraph (2) or paragraph (3) of the Schedule as is appropriate to the case.

(3.) The payment imposed in respect of a juvenile contributor shall be at the rate specified in paragraph (4) of the Schedule.
- 7.—(1.) The rates of payments specified in paragraph (1) and paragraph (2) of the Schedule shall be increased by Threepence per week in respect of males and females as on and from the third day of January, One thousand nine hundred and forty-four, and, as on Increases in rates of payments.

and from the third day of January, One thousand nine hundred and forty-nine, those rates of payments shall be further increased by Threepence per week in respect of males only.

(2.) The rate of payment specified in paragraph (3) of the Schedule shall be increased by Twopence per week as on and from the third day of January, One thousand nine hundred and forty-four, and that rate of payment shall be further increased by One penny per week as on and from the third day of January, One thousand nine hundred and forty-nine.

THE SCHEDULE.

RATES OF PAYMENTS.

- (1) For employed persons—

Males	One shilling and sixpence per week.
Females	One shilling per week.
- (2) For persons insured as partially exempt employees and, in respect of their insurance, entitled only to pensions and dependent child's allowance—

Males	Elevenpence per week.
Females	Fivepence per week.
- (3) For persons insured as partially exempt employees and, in respect of their insurance, entitled only to widow's pension and dependent child's allowance or orphan's pension—

Males	Sixpence per week.

Males and females	Fourpence per week.

CANNED FRUITS EXPORT CONTROL.

An Act to amend the *Canned Fruits Export Control Act 1926-1935*.

[Assented to 6th July, 1938.]

BE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, the Senate, and the House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Australia, as follows :—

Short title
and citation

1.—(1.) This Act may be cited as the *Canned Fruits Export Control Act 1938*.

(2.) The *Canned Fruits Export Control Act 1926-1935** is in this Act referred to as the Principal Act.

(3.) The Principal Act, as amended by this Act, may be cited as the *Canned Fruits Export Control Act 1926-1938*.
