Invalid and Old-age Pensions.

7. Section thirty-one of the Principal Act is amended by omitting Recommendafrom sub-section (2.) thereof the words "two shillings" and inserting magistrate. in their stead the words "three shillings".

8. Section forty-five of the Principal Act is amended by adding Pensioners entering at the end thereof the following proviso:---

"Provided that when a pensioner has remained an inmate of a hospital for a period of twenty-eight days he shall, upon the expiration of that period and so long thereafter as he remains an inmate, be entitled to receive a pension at the rate of three shillings per week.".

9. Section forty'seven of the Principal Act is repealed and the following section inserted in its stead :----

"47. If a successful claimant of a pension is an inmate of a Benevolent benevolent asylum he shall not, so long as he remains an inmate of Asylum inmates, such asylum, be entitled to receive a full pension but shall be entitled to receive a pension at the rate of three shillings per week.".
