## **Post and Telegraph Regulations**

No. 63 of 1967

## An Act to amend certain Regulations under the Post and Telegraph Act 1901–1966.

[Assented to 26 September 1967]

**B**<sup>E</sup> it enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, the Senate, and the House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Australia, as follows:----

1. This Act may be cited as the Post and Telegraph Regulations Act Short title. 1967.

2. This Act shall come into operation on the first day of October, One commencethousand nine hundred and sixty-seven.

3.—(1.) The Postal Regulations, the Telephone Regulations, the Amendment Telegraph Regulations and the Picturegram Regulations are amended as set out in the First, Second, Third and Fourth Schedules to this Act, respectively.

(2.) Nothing in the last preceding sub-section prevents the amendment or repeal by a regulation under the Post and Telegraph Act 1901-1966 of any regulations as amended by that sub-section.

## THE SCHEDULES

### FIRST SCHEDULE

#### Section 3.

## Amendments of the Postal Regulations

1. After regulation 91B of the Postal Regulations the following regulation is inserted:-

"91c.-(1.) This regulation applies to a postal article that-

(a) is an article to which item 1 or item 4 in the First Schedule to the Rates Act applies; or

(b) is a parcel.

"(2.) The Postmaster-General may, from time to time, by writing under his hand, determine the places between which mail may be conveyed by special despatch service.

"(3.) Where the Postmaster-General has made a determination under the last preceding sub-regulation in relation to two places, a person who sends a postal article to which this regulation applies from one of those places to the other may, upon payment of an additional fee equal to the postage that would be payable for the transmission of the article between those places and upon compliance with such conditions as the Postmaster-General determines, obtain the transmission of the article by means of the special despatch service."

(a) by omitting from sub-regulation (4.) the words "one shilling" (wherever occurring) and inserting in their stead the words "Ten cents";

3. Regulation 15 of the Picturegram Regulations is amended by omitting from sub-

regulation (2.) the words "Ten shillings " and inserting in their stead the words " One dollar

- (b) by omitting from sub-regulation (4.) the words "two shillings and sixpence" and inserting in their stead the words "Twenty-five cents"; and
- (c) by omitting from sub-regulation (5.) the words "five shillings" and inserting in their stead the words "Fifty cents".
