

FINANCIAL EMERGENCY.

No. 6 of 1933.

An Act to amend section eighteen B of the
Financial Emergency Act 1931-1932.

[Assented to 30th May, 1933.]

BE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, the Senate, and the House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Australia, as follows :—

Short title and
citation.

1.—(1.) This Act may be cited as the *Financial Emergency Act 1933.*

(2.) The *Financial Emergency Act 1931-1932** is in this Act referred to as the Principal Act.

(3.) The Principal Act, as amended by this Act, may be cited as the *Financial Emergency Act 1931-1933.*

2. Section eighteen B of the Principal Act is amended—

(a) by omitting from sub-section (1.) the words “at the commencement of this section” and inserting in their stead the words “on the twenty-fourth day of May One thousand nine hundred and thirty-three”; and

(b) by omitting from sub-section (2.) the words “commencement of this section” and inserting in their stead the words “first day of July One thousand nine hundred and thirty-three”.

An Act to grant and apply a sum out of the
Consolidated Revenue Fund for the service
of the year ending the thirtieth day of June
One thousand nine hundred and thirty-four.

[Assented to 30th May, 1933.]

Preamble.

BE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, the Senate, and the House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Australia, for the purpose of appropriating the grant originated in the House of Representatives, as follows :—

Short title.

1. This Act may be cited as the *Supply Act (No. 1) 1933-34.*

* Act No. 10, 1931, as amended by No. 47, 1931, and No. 35, 1932.

2. There shall and may be issued and applied for or towards making good the supply hereby granted to His Majesty for the service of the year ending the thirtieth day of June One thousand nine hundred and thirty-four, the sum of Five million three hundred and ninety-one thousand three hundred and ninety pounds out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund for the purposes and services expressed in the Schedule to this Act, and the Treasurer is hereby authorized and empowered to issue and apply the moneys authorized to be issued and applied.

Issue and application of £5,391,390.

3. The said sum shall be available to satisfy the warrants under the hand of the Governor-General in respect of any purposes and services set forth in the said Schedule.

Sum available for the purposes set forth in Schedule.

4. No moneys shall be expended under the authority of this Act after the thirtieth day of June One thousand nine hundred and thirty-four.
