2.--(1.) For the purposes of this Act there shall be a Trust Defence Account which shall be known as the Defence Equipment Trust Account.

(2.) The account established in pursuance of this section shall be a Trust Account for the purposes of section sixty-two A of the Audit Act 1901-1926.

3. There shall be payable out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund, Payment to Trust Account. which is hereby appropriated accordingly, to the credit of the Defence Equipment Trust Account the amount of Four million one hundred and sixty thousand pounds.

4. The moneys standing to the credit of the Defence Equip- Payments ment Trust Account may be applied-

- (a) for naval construction :
- (b) for the purchase of arms, armament, aircraft, munitions, equipment, machinery, plant, and reserves of ammunition and oil fuel: and
- (c) for defence works and buildings and the acquisition of sites therefor.
