An Act to grant and apply a sum out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund for the service of the year ending the thirtieth day of June One thousand nine hundred and forty-one and for other purposes.

BE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, the Senate, Preamble. and the House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Australia, for the purpose of appropriating the grant originated in the House of Representatives, as follows:-

1. This Act may be cited as the Supply Act (No. 2) 1940-41.

There shall and may be issued and applied for or towards Issue and application of making good the supply hereby granted to His Majesty for the service £6,732,000. of the year ending the thirtieth day of June One thousand nine hundred and forty-one the sum of Six million seven hundred and thirty-two thousand pounds out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund for the purposes and services expressed in the Schedule to this Act, and the Treasurer is hereby authorized and empowered to issue and apply the moneys authorized to be issued and applied.

4. The sum specified in the last preceding section shall be available sum available for the purpose set forth in to satisfy the warrants under the hand of the Governor-General in respect of any purposes and services expressed in the Schedule to this Act.

5. Any sums appropriated by the Supply Act (No. 1) 1940-41 for purposes and services of the Department of Supply and Developsums
