An Act to appropriate a further sum for the service of the year ended the thirtieth day of June One thousand nine hundred and eight.

[Assented to 13th December, 1909.]

BE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, the Senate, and the House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Australia, for the purpose of appropriating the grant originated in the House of Representatives, as follows:—

1. This Act may be cited as the *Supplementary Appropriation Act 1907-8*.

2. The sum of Twenty-one thousand nine hundred and five pounds which has been issued from the Consolidated Revenue Fund for the service of the year ended the thirtieth day of June One thousand

NAVAL LOAN.

No. 14 of 1909.

An Act to authorize the raising and expending of the sum of Three million five hundred thousand pounds for the purposes of Naval Defence.

[Assented to 13th December, 1909.]

BE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, the Senate, and the House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Australia, as follows:—

Short title.

1. This Act may be cited as the *Naval Loan Act 1909*.

Definition.

2. In this Act, unless the contrary intention appears—

“Commonwealth security” means any Inscribed Stock, Treasury Bond, Debenture, Stock Certificate to Bearer, or document evidencing the title of any person to any Inscribed Stock, Treasury Bond, Debenture, or Stock Certificate to Bearer, or any coupon, warrant, or document for the payment of interest thereon.
