## SUPPLY (WORKS AND SERVICES) (No. 1) 1954-55.

### No. 23 of 1954.

An Act to grant and apply a sum out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund for the service of the year ending the thirtieth day of June, One thousand nine hundred and fifty-five, for the purposes of Additions, New Works and other Services involving Capital Expenditure.

[Assented to 20th April, 1954.]

BE it enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, the Senate, and the House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Australia, for the purpose of appropriating the grant originated in the House of Representatives, as follows:—

1. This Act may be cited as the Supply (Works and Services) Act (No. 1) 1954-55.

- 2. This Act shall come into operation on the day on which it commencement. receives the Royal Assent.
- 3. There shall and may be issued and applied for or towards Issue and making good the supply hereby granted to Her Majesty for the sapplication of salita application of salita appl service of the year ending the thirtieth day of June, One thousand nine hundred and fifty-five, the sum of Thirty-one million one hundred and twenty-eight thousand pounds out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund for the purposes and services expressed in the Schedule to this Act, and the Treasurer is hereby authorized and empowered to issue and apply the moneys authorized to be issued and applied.

4. The sum specified in the last preceding section shall be available to satisfy the warrants under the hand of the Governor-General in respect of any purposes and services expressed in the Schedule to Schedule. this Act.

5. No money shall be expended under the authority of this Act Limit of period of expenditure. after the thirtieth day of June. One thousand nine hundred and fifty-five.
