STATES GRANTS (YOUTH EMPLOYMENT). No. 10 of 1939.

An Act to grant and apply out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund a sum for the purposes of Financial Assistance to the States.

[Assented to 20th June, 1939.]

Preamble.

B it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, the Senate, and the House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Australia, for the purpose of appropriating the grant originated in the House of Representatives, as follows :---

Short title.

1. This Act may be cited as the States Grants (Youth Employment) Act 1939.

Commencement.

2. This Act shall come into operation on the day on which it receives the Royal Assent.

3. There shall be payable out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund, Appropriation. which is hereby appropriated accordingly, the sum of Two hundred thousand pounds for the purpose of financial assistance to the States.

4. The amount payable under this Act to each State shall be Allocation of the amount shown in the following table opposite to the name of grant. that State :---

5. The amount granted to a State by this Act is granted upon Condition of the condition that it is used by the State, in such manner and subject to such conditions as the Minister approves, in providing facilities for the training for, and the placing in, employment of persons between the ages of eighteen years and twenty-five years.

6. The amount granted to a State by this Act shall be paid to Method of that State at such times and in such manner as the Treasurer approves. States.

NATIONAL REGISTRATION.

No. 11 of 1939.

An Act to provide for the taking of Censuses for the purpose of National Registration, for the establishment of a National Register, and for other purposes.

[Assented to 20th June, 1939.]

BE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, the Senate, and the House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Australia, as follows :---

1. This Act may be cited as the National Registration Act 1939.

2. This Act shall come into operation on the day on which it Commencement. receives the Royal Assent.

3. In this Act, unless the contrary intention appears—

"officer" includes the Executive Officer and any officer or employee, whether temporary or permanent, of the Commonwealth or of a State, who is declared by the Minister by notice in the *Gazette* to be an officer for the purposes of this Act, or whose office is so declared to be an office to which this Act applies;
