# STATES GRANTS (UNEMPLOYMENT RELIEF).

### No. 71 of 1936.

An Act to grant and apply out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund sums for the purposes of Financial Assistance to the States of the Commonwealth in the provision of Assistance to persons out of employment.

[Assented to 5th December, 1936.]

Preamble.

BE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, the Senate, and the House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Australia, for the purpose of appropriating the grant originated in the House of Representatives, as follows:—

1. This Act may be cited as the States Grants (Unemployment Relief) Act 1936.

Short title.

2. There shall be payable out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund, Appropriation of \$150,000 for the purpose of financial financial assistance to the States, the sum of One hundred and fifty thousand assistance to pounds.

3.—(1.) Out of the amount appropriated by this Act there shall, subject to this section, be granted to each State, by way of financial assistance, the amount specified in this section opposite the name of that State, namely:-

(2.) Any amount granted to a State under this section shall be granted upon condition that it is expended by the State in the provision of assistance to persons out of employment.

## COMMONWEALTH PUBLIC SERVICE.

#### No. 72 of 1936.

## An Act to amend the Commonwealth Public Service Act 1922-1934.

[Assented to 7th December, 1936.]

BE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, the Senate, and the House of Romandation and the House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Australia, as follows :-

1.—(1.) This Act may be cited as the Commonwealth Public Short title and Service Act 1936.

- (2.) The Commonwealth Public Service Act 1922-1934\* is in this Act referred to as the Principal Act.
- (3.) The Principal Act, as amended by this Act, may be cited as the Commonwealth Public Service Act 1922-1936.
- 2. Section eleven of the Principal Act is amended by inserting Appointment of Public Service in sub-section (1.), after the word "persons", the words ", to be Board. called the Public Service Board".
