60.—(1.) Every employer shall, for the purposes of this Act, keep Books, accounts recording full particulars of all employment to be preserved by him of waterside workers, and shall preserve those books or accounts for a period of not less than five years after the completion of the employment to which they relate.

Penalty: One hundred pounds.

- (2.) This section shall not apply so as to require the preservation of any books, accounts or documents—
 - (a) in respect of which the Commissioner has notified a person that preservation is not required; and
 - (b) of a company which has been dissolved.
- 61. The Commissioner, or any officer authorized by the Commissioner in that behalf, shall at all times have full and free access to all buildings, places, books, documents and other papers for any of the purposes of this Act and for any such purpose may make extracts from or copies of any such books, documents or papers.

62.—(1.) In any action, prosecution or other proceeding in any Appearance by court by the Commissioner or a Deputy Commissioner, he may appear either personally or by a barrister or solicitor, or by an officer.

- (2.) The appearance of any such officer, and his statement that he appears by authority of the Commissioner or a Deputy Commissioner, shall be sufficient evidence of such authority.
- 63. The Governor-General may make regulations, not inconsistent Begulations. with this Act, prescribing all matters which by this Act are required or permitted to be prescribed, or which are necessary or convenient to be prescribed, for giving effect to this Act, and, in particular, for prescribing penalties not less than One pound or more than Twenty pounds for any breach of the regulations.

STEVEDORING INDUSTRY CHARGE.

No. 4 of 1947.

An Act to impose a Charge in respect of the Employment of Waterside Workers.

[Assented to 28th March, 1947.]

E it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, the Senate, and the House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Australia, as follows:—

1. This Act may be cited as the Stevedoring Industry Charge Short title. Act 1947.

Commencement.

2. This Act shall come into operation on a date to be fixed by Proclamation.

Incorporation.

3. The Stevedoring Industry Charge Assessment Act 1947 shall be incorporated and read as one with this Act.

Imposition of charge.

4. A charge is imposed in respect of the employment of waterside workers after the commencement of this Act.

Rate of charge.

5. The rate of the charge shall be four and one-half pence for every man-hour of employment.

Person liable.

6. The charge in respect of the employment of any waterside workers shall be paid by the employer of those waterside workers.

INTERNATIONAL MONETARY AGREEMENTS.

No. 5 of 1947.

An Act to approve of Australia becoming a Member of the International Monetary Fund and of the International Bank for Reconstruction and Development and to make such provisions as are necessary or expedient by reason of the Membership of Australia of the Fund and of the Bank.

[Assented to 2nd April, 1947.]

BE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, the Senate, and the House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Australia, as follows:—

Short title.

1. This Act may be cited as the International Monetary Agreements Act 1947.

Commencement.

2. This Act shall come into operation on the day on which it receives the Royal Assent.
