Certain proceedings under Re-establishment and Employment Act. Sixth Schedule.

7. Section forty-five of the Principal Act is amended by inserting in sub-sections (2.) and (3.), before the word "forty-three", the words "nineteen or".

8. After the Fifth Schedule to the Principal Act the following Schedule is added :—

TRACTOR BOUNTY.

No. 73 of 1947.

An Act to amend the *Tractor Bounty Act* 1939-1944.

[Assented to 4th December, 1947.]

BE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, the Senate, and the House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Australia, for the purpose of appropriating the grant originated in the House of Representatives, as follows :—

Short title and citation.

1.—(1.) This Act may be cited as the *Tractor Bounty Act* 1947.

(2.) The *Tractor Bounty Act* 1939-1944* is in this Act referred to as the Principal Act.

(3.) The Principal Act, as amended by this Act, may be cited as the *Tractor Bounty Act* 1939-1947.

Commencement.

2. This Act shall be deemed to have come into operation on the twenty-fourth day of October, One thousand nine hundred and forty-seven.

3. Section four of the Principal Act is amended by omitting sub-section (1.) and inserting in its stead the following sub-section :— Limit of annual bounty.

“(1.) The total amount of bounty payable under this Act shall be—

- (a) in respect of tractors produced during the financial year which commenced on the first day of July, One thousand nine hundred and forty-seven—Eighty thousand pounds ;
- (b) in respect of tractors produced during the financial year commencing on the first day of July, One thousand nine hundred and forty-eight—Two hundred and twenty-five thousand pounds ;
- (c) in respect of tractors produced during the financial year commencing on the first day of July, One thousand nine hundred and forty-nine—Three hundred thousand pounds ; and
- (d) in respect of tractors produced during the period commencing on the first day of July, One thousand nine hundred and fifty and ending on the twenty-third day of October, One thousand nine hundred and fifty—One hundred thousand pounds.”.

4. Section six of the Principal Act is amended by omitting the word “eight” and inserting in its stead the word “eleven”. Specification of bounty.

5. Section seven of the Principal Act is amended by inserting in the table contained in sub-section (1.), after the word and figures “Exceeding 35”, the words and figures “but not exceeding 60”. Rates of bounty.

AUSTRALIAN SOLDIERS' REPATRIATION (No. 2).

No. 74 of 1947.

An Act to amend the *Australian Soldiers' Repatriation Act 1920-1946*, as amended by the *Commonwealth Public Service Act 1947* and by the *Australian Soldiers' Repatriation Act 1947*.

[Assented to 5th December, 1947.]

BE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, the Senate, and the House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Australia, as follows :—
