TASMANIA GRANT.

No. 32 of 1928.

An Act to grant and apply out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund a sum for the purpose of Financial Assistance to the State of Tasmania.

[Assented to 22nd September, 1928.]

Preamble.

BE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, the Senate, and the House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Australia, for the purpose of appropriating the grant originated in the House of Representatives, as follows:—

Short title.

1. This Act may be cited as the *Tasmania Grant Act* 1928.

Payment of
£220,000 for
financial
assistance to
Tasmania.

2. Subject to this Act, there shall be payable for the purposes of financial assistance to the State of Tasmania, the sum of Two hundred and twenty thousand pounds.

3. Payment of the said sum of Two hundred and twenty thousand pounds shall be made in equal monthly instalments during the year ending on the thirtieth day of June, One thousand nine hundred and twenty-nine. Period and method of payment.

4. Payments in accordance with this Act shall be made out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund which is hereby appropriated accordingly. Appropriation.

LOAN (No. 2).

No. 33 of 1928.

An Act to authorize the Raising and Expending
of certain Sums of Money.

[Assented to 22nd September, 1928.]

BE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, the Senate, and the House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Australia, as follows:—

1. This Act may be cited as the *Loan Act (No. 2) 1928*.

Short title.

2. The Treasurer may from time to time under the provisions of the *Commonwealth Inscribed Stock Act 1911-1927*, or under the provisions of any Act authorizing the issue of Treasury Bills, borrow moneys not exceeding in the whole the amount of Ten million seven hundred thousand pounds.

Authority to borrow
£10,700,000.

3. The amount borrowed shall be issued and applied only for the expenses of borrowing and for the purposes of appropriations made or to be made by law.

Purpose for which money may be borrowed.
