

(2.) The *Bills of Exchange Act 1909-1932**, as amended by this Act, may be cited as the *Bills of Exchange Act 1909-1936*.

2. After section seventy-seven of the *Bills of Exchange Act 1909-1932* the following section is inserted :—

“ 77A. A bill issued in Australia which is presented for acceptance, accepted, or payable, outside Australia shall not be invalid by reason only that it is not stamped, or is not properly stamped, in accordance with any law for the time being in force requiring that bill to be stamped, and any such bill which is unstamped or is not properly stamped may be received in evidence on payment of the proper duty and penalty (if any).”.

TRADE MARKS.

No. 75 of 1936.

An Act to amend section one hundred and fifteen of the *Trade Marks Act 1905-1934*.

[Assented to 7th December, 1936.]

BE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, the Senate, and the House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Australia, as follows :—

1.—(1.) This Act may be cited as the *Trade Marks Act 1936*.

Short title and citation.

(2.) The *Trade Marks Act 1905-1934**, as amended by this Act, may be cited as the *Trade Marks Act 1905-1936*.

2. Section one hundred and fifteen of the *Trade Marks Act 1905-1934* is amended—

International arrangements for protection of trade marks.

(a) by inserting in sub-section (1.), after the word “made,” (second occurring), the words “or the legal representative or assignee of that person,”; and

(b) by omitting from that sub-section the word “his” (first occurring) and inserting in its stead the word “the”.
