INVALID AND OLD-AGE PENSIONS APPROPRIATION.

An Act to grant and apply out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund a Sum for Invalid and Old-age Pensions.

[Assented to 13th September, 1929.]

Preamble.

BE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, the Senate, and the House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Australia, for the purpose of appropriating the grant originated in the House of Representatives, as follows:—

Short title.

1. This Act may be cited as the Invalid and Old-age Pensions Appropriation Act 1929.

Appropriation of £10,000,000 for invalid and oid-age pensions.

2. There shall be payable out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund, which is hereby appropriated accordingly, for the purposes of the Trust Account established under the *Audit Act* 1901–1926, and known as the Invalid and Old-age Pensions Fund, the sum of Ten million pounds for invalid and old-age pensions.

WAR PENSIONS APPROPRIATION.

Preamble.

BE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, the Senate, and the House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Australia, for the purpose of appropriating the grant originated in the House of Representatives, as follows:—

Short title.

1. This Act may be cited as the War Pensions Appropriation Act, 1929.

2. CUSTOMS TARIFF VALIDATION.

No. 21 of 1929.

An Act to provide for the Validation of Collections of Duties of Customs under Tariff Proposals.

[Assented to 13th September, 1929.]

BE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, the Senate, and the House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Australia, as follows:---

1. This Act may be cited as the Customs Tariff Validation Act 1929. Short title and

- 2. In this Act "Tariff proposals" means the proposed Duties Definition. of Customs introduced into the House of Representatives on the twenty-second day of August One thousand nine hundred and twenty-nine.
- 3. All Duties of Customs demanded or collected (whether before validation of the dissolution or expiry of the present House of Representatives or collections under Tariff at or after such dissolution or expiry and on or before the twentieth proposals day of December One thousand nine hundred and twenty-nine) pursuant to Tariff proposals shall be deemed to have been lawfully imposed and lawfully demanded or collected.
