- (c) the percentage by weight of pulp produced in Australia from timber grown in Australia to the total weight of pulp used by each manufacturer in the production of the paper on which bounty was paid; and
- (d) such other particulars as are prescribed.
- 24. The Governor-General may make regulations, not inconsistent Regulations. with this Act, prescribing all matters which by this Act are required or permitted to be prescribed, or which are necessary or convenient to be prescribed, for carrying out or giving effect to this Act, and in particular for prescribing-

(a) the form in which applications for bounty shall be made;

- (b) the conditions to be observed by manufacturers in respect of giving notice of their intention to claim bounty and the time or times within which applications for bounty shall be lodged with the Collector:
- (c) the conditions of manufacture of paper at factories; and
- (d) penalties not exceeding Fifty pounds for any breach of the regulations.

## WAR PENSIONS APPROPRIATION.

## No. 65 of 1938.

An Act to grant and apply out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund a sum for War Pensions.

[Assented to 10th December, 1938.]

BE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, the Senate, Preamble and the House of Representatives of the Control of th and the House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Australia, for the purpose of appropriating the grant originated in the House of Representatives, as follows:—

- 1. This Act may be cited as the War Pensions Appropriation Short title. Act 1938.
- 2. This Act shall come into operation on the day on which it commencement. receives the Royal Assent.
- 3. There shall be payable out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund, Appropriation of £10,000,000 which is hereby appropriated accordingly, for the purposes of the for war Trust Account established under the Audit Act 1901-1934 and known pensions. as the War Pensions Fund, the sum of Ten million pounds for war pensions.
