

26. The Governor-General may make regulations, not inconsistent with this Act, prescribing all matters which by this Act are required or permitted to be prescribed or which are necessary or convenient to be prescribed for giving effect to this Act and in particular for prescribing penalties not exceeding Five hundred pounds or imprisonment for six months for any offence against the regulations. Regulations.

27. Where the Governor-General is satisfied that the continuance in operation of this Act is no longer necessary either for the security and defence of Australia or for the execution and maintenance of the Constitution and of the laws of the Commonwealth, the Governor-General shall make a Proclamation accordingly and thereupon this Act shall be deemed to have been repealed. Duration of Act.

WAR PENSIONS APPROPRIATION.

No. 17 of 1950.

An Act to grant and apply out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund a sum for War Pensions.

[Assented to 30th October, 1950.]

BE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, the Senate, and the House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Australia, for the purpose of appropriating the grant originated in the House of Representatives, as follows:—

1. This Act may be cited as the *War Pensions Appropriation Act* 1950. Short title.

2. This Act shall come into operation on the day on which it receives the Royal Assent. Commencement.

3. There shall be payable out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund, which is hereby appropriated accordingly, for the purposes of the Trust Account established under the *Audit Act* 1901-1948 and known as the War Pensions Fund, the sum of Twenty-eight million pounds for war pensions. Appropriation of £28,000,000 for war pensions.
