AMENDMENTS OF THE TRAFFIC REGULATIONS

1. These Regulations shall come into operation on 1 July 1974. Commencement
2. Regulation 4 of the Traffic Regulations is repealed. Repeal of regulation 4
- 3.(1) Regulation 32(1) of the Traffic Regulations is amended by omitting paragraphs (b) and (c). Speed limits at inter-sections
- (2) Regulation 32 of the Traffic Regulations is amended by omitting sub-regulations (2), (3) and (4).
4. The Traffic Regulations are amended as set out in the Schedule. Amendments for metric conversion
