An Act to further amend "The Bush Fires Act, 1864."

[Assented to, November 17th, 1882.]

WHEREAS it is expedient to further amend "The Bush Fires Act, 1864"—Be it therefore Enacted by the Governor of the Province of South Australia, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly of the said province, in this present Parliament assembled, as follows: Preamble.

1. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained in "The Bush Fires Act, 1864," or the Act No. 15 of 1874, to amend "The Bush Fires Act, 1864," during the months of February, March, and April stubble and scrub may be burnt outside the limits of District Councils at any time between sunrise and sunset. Time for burning stubble and scrub.

2. No fire for the burning of stubble or scrub shall be lighted unless a space of at least half a chain in width shall have been ploughed or cleared of scrub, surrounding the block or field proposed to be burnt. Space to be cleared.

3. This Act and "The Bush Fires Act, 1864," shall be incorporated and be read therewith as one Act. Incorporation.
