An Act to amend the Laws of the Customs in South Australia.

[Assented to, 1st September, 1859.]

THEREAS it is expedient to alter the duties of Customs imposed Preamble. in the Province of South Australia, in the particulars hereinafter mentioned—Be it therefore Enacted, by the Governor-in-Chief of the Province of South Australia, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly of the said Province, in this present Parliament assembled, as follows:

- 1. From and after the passing of this Act, all corn bags and corn corn sacks, manures, sacks, all substances used solely as manures, together with wheat, free of duty. flour, and the following seeds, namely, lucerne, clover, tares, sainfoin, rye, and rye-grass shall be admitted into the said Province free of duty.
- 2. There shall be charged on manufactured tobacco imported Increased duty on into the said Province, or cleared from bond therein, a duty of tobacco. Customs of One Shilling and Fourpence for every pound imported, in lieu of the duty of One Shilling heretofore charged and made payable; and such duty shall be paid to Her Majesty, for the public uses of the said Province, and the support of the Government thereof.

3. The Collector of Customs, and all officers of Customs, in the Indemnity to Collecsaid Province, shall not be liable to, and are hereby indemnified and protected against any action, claim, or damages to which he or thev

they might otherwise have been liable by reason of any refusal to deliver any manufactured tobacco imported as aforesaid, or cleared from bond before the passing of this Act, without payment of the said duty of One Shilling and Fourpence per pound, or by reason of their having admitted any of the articles hereinbefore mentioned free of duty.

Commencement of Act.

4. This Act shall take effect from the passing thereof,
