An Act to repeal Act No. 34 of 1876, and to make provisions in lieu thereof, and for other purposes.

[Assented to, November 11th, 1885.]

THEREAS it is expedient to alter the duties of Customs Preamble. imposed in the Province of South Australia in manner hereinafter provided—Be it therefore Enacted by the Governor of the Province of South Australia, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly of the said province, in this present Parliament assembled, as follows:

- 1. Act No. 34 of 1876, intituled "An Act to amend the Laws of Repeal of existing the Customs," is hereby repealed, except section 4 thereof, and so far as relates to anything lawfully done or commenced or contracted to be done before the commencement of this Act, and except so far as may be necessary to enable any punishment to be inflicted, or penalty enforced, for any act, matter, or thing contrary to the provisions of the said Act, and also except as to any duty, or arrears of duty, or drawback due or payable at any time before the passing of this Act, under the provisions of the said Act hereby repealed.
- 2. In lieu of all other duties of Customs there shall be raised, Duties. levied, collected, and paid unto Her Majesty for the uses of the said province, and support of the Government thereof, the several duties of Customs set forth in the Schedules hereto, and no others.
- 3. The Collector of Customs, and all officers of Customs are Indemnity to Col. hereby indemnified, protected, and held harmless, against any lector of Customs. action,

action, claim, or damage to which he or they might otherwise have been liable by reason of any refusal to deliver any goods imported into the said province after the eighteenth day of August, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-five, or in bond on that day without payment of the duties set forth in the Schedule hereto, or without payment of the duties authorised to be levied by any Act in force within the said province at the time of the coming into operation of this Act.

Repeal of sections 14, 15, and 16 of Act 196 of 1881. 4. Sections 14, 15, and 16, Part III. of the "Custom Convention Act, 1881," are hereby repealed: Provided always that the duties on spirits in case shall be collected in the manner provided by the Second Schedule thereunto attached, until the seventeenth day of October, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-five.

Duties chargeable in Northern Territory with certain exceptions. 5. The provisions of the schedule duties hereunto attached shall be chargeable in respect of goods imported, not being animals, into the Northern Territory of this province, except on goods enumerated in the Schedule referred to in the third section of Act 254 of 1882, intituled "An Act to amend the Laws relating to the Levying and Collection of Customs and other Duties in the Northern Territory," which will be chargeable with the duties referred to in such Schedule.

Duty on colonial spirits.

6. The 17th and 18th sections of the "Customs Convention Act, 1881," and section 46 of "The Distillation Act, 1884," are hereby repealed, and in lieu thereof the following shall be and may be cited as the 46th section of "The Distillation Act, 1884"—From and after the passing of this Act, the duty payable upon all spirits that may be distilled in the said province from grapes, fruit, wine, potatoes, roots, or grain, or other produce, shall be Nine Shillings and Fourpence for every gallon; and such duty shall be paid upon the standard gallon measure of spirits of the strength of proof by Sykes's hydrometer, and so in proportion for any greater or less strength than proof, and also upon any deficiencies ascertained in the manner herein directed.

In the name and on behalf of Her Majesty, I hereby assent to this Bill.
